#### **Data Protection Officer**

The data protection officer (DPO) is responsible for overseeing the implementation of this policy, monitoring our compliance with data protection law, and developing related policies and guide- lines where applicable.

They will provide an annual report of their activities directly to the Trust governing board and, where relevant, report to the Trust board their advice and recommendations on Academy data protection issues.

The DPO is also the first point of contact for individuals whose data the Trust processes, and for the ICO.

Full details of the DPO's responsibilities are set out in their job description.

#### **Privacy Notice**

Under data protection law, individuals have a right to be informed about how the Trust use any personal data that we hold about them. We comply with this right by providing 'privacy notices' (sometimescalled 'fair

processing notices') to individuals where we are processing their personal data. This privacy notice explains how we collect, store and use personal data about governors. We, Greater Manchester AcademiesTrustarethe'data controller' for the purposes of data protectionlaw. Our Data Protection Officer is Mr Andrew Woolley, (see 'Contact us' below).

#### The Personal Data we hold

Personal data that we may collect, use, store and share (when appropriate) about governors includes, butisnot restricted to:

- Contact details, contact preferences, date of birth, identification documents;
- Governing body details;
- Governor type and term of office;
- Photographs;
- CCTV images captured inAcademy.

#### Why we use the data

We use this data to:

- Maintain a governordatabase;
- Contact governor regarding statutory information
- Deliver governor services to the academy

### Our legal basis of using this data

We only collect and use governors' personal data when the law allows us to. Most commonly, we processit where:

- Ill We need to comply with a legal obligation;
- Ill We need it to perform an official task in the public interest.
- Ill Less commonly, we may also process governors' personal data in situations where:
- Ill We have obtained consent to use it in a certain way;
- Ill We need to protect the individual's vital interests (or someone else's interests).

Where we have obtained consent to use governors' personal data, this consent can be with drawn at anytime. We will make this clear when we ask for consent, and explain how consent can be with drawn.

Some of thereasons listed above for collecting and using governors' personal data overlap, and there may be several grounds which justify our use of this data.

#### **Collecting this information**

Whilethemajority of information we collect aboutgovernors is mandatory, there is some information that can be provided voluntarily. Whenever we seek to collect information from you, we make it clear whether providing it is mandatory or optional. If it is mandatory, we will explain the possible consequences of not complying

#### How we store this information

We keeppersonalinformationaboutgovernors while they are performing the role for an academy or the Trust. We may also keep it beyond the point they cease to perform their role at our academy or the Trust if this is necessary in order to comply with our legal obligations. Our Data Retention Policy sets out how long we keep information about governors. You can request a copy of this policy by email from DPO@gmatrust.co.uk

#### **Data Sharing**

We do not share information about governors with any third party without consent unless the law and our policiesallow ustodo so. Where it is legallyrequired or necessary(and itcomplies with dataprotection law) we may share personal information about governors with:

- Ill The relevant local authority—to meet our legal obligations to share certain information with it, such as safeguarding concerns and exclusions;
- Ill The academy where you are governor or the Trust—to meet our legal obligations to share certain information with it;
- Ill The Company House to meet our legal obligations to share certain information with it;
- Ill The Department for Education to meet our legal obligations and acting in the public interest regarding the education of young people;
- Ill Our regulator Ofsted, underwhom we have alegalobligation and apublic interest to provide aquality education for governors;
- Ill Our auditors to meet our legal obligations of having an internal and external audit;
- III Police forces, courts, tribunals fulfilling our legal obligations to prevent crime and comply with court orders etc.

## **Transferring dataInternationally**

Where we transferpersonal data to accountry or territory outside the European Economic Area, we will do so in accordance with data protection law.

## Governors' rights regarding personal data

Individuals have a right tomake a 'subject access request' to gain access to personal information that the Trust holds about them.

If you make a subject access request, and if we do hold information about you, we will:

- Ill Give you a description of it;
- Ill Tell you why we are holding and processing it, and how long we will keep it for;
- Ill Explain where we got it from, if not from you or your child;
- Ill Tell you who it has been, or will be, shared with;
- Ill Let you know whether any automated decision-making is being applied to the data, and any consequences of this;
- Ill Giveyou acopy of theinformation in an intelligible form. Individuals also have the right for their personal information to be transmitted electronically to another organisation in certain circumstances. If you would like to make a request please contact our Data Protection Officer

## **Other Rights**

Underdataprotectionlaw,individualshavecertainrightsregarding howtheirpersonaldataisusedand kept safe,including the right to:

- Ill Object to the use of personal data if it would cause, or is causing, damage or distress;
- Ill Prevent it being used to send direct marketing;
- Ill Object to decisions being taken by automated means (by a computer or machine, rather than by a person);
- III In certain circumstances, have inaccurate personal data corrected, deleted or destroyed, or restrict processing;
- Ill Claimcompensation fordamagescaused by abreach of the data protection regulations. To exercise any of these rights, please contact our Data Protection Officer.

#### **Complaints**

We take any complaints about our collection and use of personal information very seriously.
